## ¡Arriba!

### **Materials for Each Group**

- the same number of bingo chips for each player
- a non-transparent cup
- 2 dice


**Groups:** Students can be in groups of 4-8

**How to Win:** Take everyone else's bingo chips.


**How to Lose:** Lose all of your bingo chips, and you're out of the game.

### How to read the dice:

The larger number is always said first.



Doubles are worth more than any other number!



= 11

Counts as higher than any number that isn't a double!

= 55

Counts as higher than any number except for 66.

= 66

The highest roll!

There's one more twist!



# If you roll 21, show everyone and shout ¡Arriba! Everyone but you has to put a chip in the pot!

It doesn't matter what the previous person rolled. You cannot lie about rolling ¡Arriba!

### How to Play:

Sit in a circle and take turns rolling the dice in the cup. Only the person who rolled can peek under the cup and see what numbers were rolled. Then, the roller has to say the number out loud...but can tell the truth **or lie**!

The next person can either roll the dice or accuse the previous person of **LYING!** If the person told the truth, the accuser has to put a bingo chip in the pot. If the person was lying, he has to put a bingo chip in the pot. When a person is caught lying, the game resets and the next person can roll any number.

Here's a twist: Each student has to say a number LARGER than the previous person. Yes, this means you will have to lie sometimes! Don't forget that doubles count as higher than non-doubles.

### Vocabulary

¿Cuántos tienes tú? How many do you have?

Tengo \_\_\_\_. I have \_\_\_.

¡Eso es una mentira! That's a lie!

Es la verdad. It's the truth.

### Tips

- Don't move your cup after rolling or the numbers might change.
- For Round #2, reverse directions or trade seats!
- If a person is caught saying a number <u>lower</u> than needed, or if they say the smaller number first (23 instead of 32), they have to put a bingo chip in the pot!
